#### Who we are

MELIOS Animal Protection Society in Gythio, Peloponessos, Greece, an animal shelter with currently more than 200 dogs and 30 cats.

In 2010, it was built by two Greek women who were no longer willing to watch the dogs and cats being wounded on the roadside wounded, poisoned, ill-treated or shot dead.

### Our shelter

The animal shelter MELIOS had to move twice since the establishment in 2010 due to problems (e.g. poisoning of 28 dogs in one week, hostility of the neighbors). Since November 2013 we are in our current animal shelter.

### What we do

We take care of neglected, starving, wounded and homeless animals. Wounded and sick dogs get the required medical treatment. Whenever we have enough money, we sterilize dogs and cats. This is a big expense for us, but very necessary and helpful on the long run.

We also try to find good homes for them by hanging up posters and ads in the area. After finding a good place for a dog, we check on it later to see if the dog is fine and treated well. If this is not the case, we take the dog back to us. Would not that be a consideration for you? Our dogs are socially very treatable.

### What we need

Unfortunately, we do not have enough money to sterilize all our animals, to buy all the required medicines, to rescue more animals, make more room for sick, weak or pregnant dogs and young puppies. We particularly need more medicine for leishmaniasis, a very common illness here.

In very clear terms: We would like for our animal shelter to rescue more dogs and cats. It is very painful to refuse an animal in distress simply because we do not have enough space or money.
